The Irish team *Headcase* has triumphed at the 2025 J/24 European Championship, held in Wemeldinge, the Netherlands—securing their third consecutive European title. Dutch team *Jack Around*, led by Rutger Krijger, earned the silver medal, while German team *Schwere Jungs*, helmed by Stefan Karsunke, took bronze.

The Championship took place from July 7-12. Day one focused on technical inspections of boats and sails. On day two, final checks were completed, followed by a skippers' briefing led by the organizing committee and race officials. On Tuesday at 14:00, a practice race was held—an ideal warm-up that allowed teams to navigate the strong currents of the Oosterschelde and familiarize themselves with the racecourse.



HEADCASI

The event was officially opened later that evening at 18:00 by the chair of the Dutch J/24 Class Association. The 2025 edition of the Europeans centered around cross-generational connection, learning, and of course, the competition for victory.

On Wednesday, July 9, the starting vessel left port as scheduled, followed closely by all 20 teams. Due to unstable wind conditions, the AP flag was briefly raised, but once the breeze stabilized, four races were sailed under ideal weather. *Headcase* dominated the day with four first-place finishes, showcasing their mastery of tidal sailing.

Jack Around delivered a strong performance to secure second place, and reigning German champion Hungriger Wolf finished the day in third. The long day on the water concluded with a festive dinner featuring Premier mussels and live music.

Thursday began with the AP flag hoisted again, anticipating a repeat of Tuesday's light conditions. Fortunately, the seabreeze filled in around 13:00, allowing two more races from 14:00 onward. *Headcase* extended their lead, while *Jack Around* slipped to fourth overall. *Schwere Jungs* moved past *Hungriger Wolf* to claim third position in the standings.













Forecasts throughout the week were encouraging, with consistent afternoon breezes from the northwest and occasional shifts to the west. International teams praised the venue and conditions, calling the sailing area beautiful and suitably challenging for a European Championship.

Friday began with the AP flag raised, delaying the teams' departure until around 12:30. Four races were sailed that day. After completing a total of 10 races, only two more were scheduled for Saturday which ultimately became two and a half. The penultimate race was abandoned by the Race Committee due to a significant wind shift. Finally, at around 13:30, the very last race of the event was held.


Thanks to IJCA Technical Committee member Michael Peters for this report:

It's winter in Australia, and despite chilly 12 degree mornings and winds between 5 and 40 knots (yes it was cancelled), the sailing continues.

The Hodges Sandringham One Design Winter Series at Sandringham Yacht Club (home of the 2026 Epigen World Championship) attracted up to 11 starters including six new players keen to gear up for Worlds selection in five months. Of note, *Haywire* Barney Walker, sporting new sails, showed form with a first and third in only their second outing since joining the Class. *Gridlock* Wayne Bates a first, and *Hyperactive* Scott Buckingham constantly around the top of the fleet. These teams, along with series leader *Poker Face* Adam Keys-Tilley, *Jab* Warren Slater (who is heading to Plymouth) and *Bruschetta VI* Hugo Ottaway,

make up the top places with three race days remaining before the start of our summer season in October.

Following the success of the Vakaros race management system at the Beechers Handmade Cheese 2024 World Championship in Seattle, we have purchased the system for Australia. Our Race Officers and competitors are learning the benefits this new technology brings to the racecourse. The Vakaros race management and boat devices really are the "Next Exciting Chapter" in yacht racing, and have been overwhelmingly embraced by all involved.

We are very excited to have this system for the 2026 Epigen Worlds.

Off the water, Hodges Real Estate Sandringham have confirmed their continuation of their sponsorship of our Winter and Summer 2025/2026 season. This is the third year Hodges have supported J/24 Victoria.

Our 2026 Worlds sponsor, Epigen Industrial Paint Systems, has purchased four North spinnakers with Epigen logos (keep an eye out for these in Plymouth), Gill sailing jackets for the Worlds Committee, tee shirts for all the teams going to Plymouth, and lastly, sponsoring a social night all in the name of Epigen 2026 Worlds.

Sandringham Yacht Club, host of the 2026 Epigen Worlds, has reinvested significantly with the replacement of two new hardstand cranes, and purchased (in partnership with J/24 owners) 10 new hardstand J/24 trolleys. This purchase gives us increased capacity to house interstate and overseas Js.

Our sponsors, yacht club and supporters have created a strong and vibrant Class, and we can't thank them enough.



Western Australian Fleet. Perth.

Royal Freshwater Bay Yacht Club, located on the Swan River at Melville Waters, has the largest fleet of J/24s in WA. The summer regatta results have Jazz Aaron Kanther winning the Mid Summer Series out of 24 mixed fleet entries and Fun 2 Ron Thomson fourth in the Saturday Summer Series amongst a mixed fleet of 20. The current Winter Series racing is around fixed marks with a course length 9 km on Melville. Others in the fleet: JJF Jo Wilson, Jpeg Shann Evans and Flashback Olisin Coffey. Four crews are keen to contest the Worlds selection series in January. Aaron Kanther is purchasing a second boat driving 3400 km (2117 miles) from Perth to Melbourne, whilst Ron Thomson has chartered a local boat.

The re-emergence of the J/24 Class has seen five Js being repurposed back into club and Class racing at the Royal South Australian Yacht Squadron. Two owners, Kiaron Cowley and Mark Evans, have expressed interest in competing in the Worlds selection series and are currently refurbishing their boats in time for January. Class stalwart Pete Stevens has almost completed his restoration of *Haywire* (yes there are two of them), having it ready for charter for both the Worlds selection / National Title in January and Epigen Worlds in November 2026.

Youth on the Helm: Sydney Harbour Hosts Third Annual J/24 Youth Challenge

The sails were set, the breeze was light, and the competition was fierce as Sydney's third J/24 Youth Challenge returned in June 2025—bigger, bolder and brimming with rising talent.

Over 30 young sailors, representing clubs from around Sydney Harbour, converged at Manly Yacht Club for a weekend showdown of five tight races. This year marked the first time the regatta was held on a weekend—giving schoolbooks a break and letting the youth shine on the water. The format was windward/leeward, with youth crews, some seasoned and some fresh to keelboats, taking full control. Boat owners could ride along but weren't allowed to call tactics. The decisions—good, bad or brilliant—were all on the shoulders of the next generation.

Race 1 kicked off in a teasing northerly of 5–8 knots. *Innamincka*, with Ashleigh Larkin at the helm and a Middle

Harbour junior crew, burst off the line with style. But it was *Ace*, skippered by William Hough from Manly, who played the wind shifts perfectly and claimed the bullet, just ahead of *Innamincka*. A tight battle saw *Waterhound* (Fin MacLennan) edge the girls from Middle Harbour 16 ft Skiff Club on *JSpot* for third, and close behind just one second separated *Kaotic* (Josh Zatz) and *Okavango Delta* (Macie Bourke) at the finish.

As the breeze faded in Race 2, *Innamincka* fought back to take the win over *Ace*, while *Kaotic* punched through for third in the softer conditions.

A mid-regatta wind shift brought a course reset in a building southeasterly for Race 3. *Innamincka* led early but stalled in a hole up the second work. *Ace* capitalized and took the top spot again, with *Kaotic* staying consistent in third.

Race 4 had its share of drama—*Waterhound* jumped the start, while *Ace* and *Kaotic* nailed a mid-line launch. *JSpot* surged early but got caught in a lull. Meanwhile, *Innamincka* climbed from fifth to second with a tactical masterclass. *Ace* took yet another win.

In the **final race**, *Ace* sealed the regatta with a dominant start and lead at every mark. *JSpot* showed real grit to finish third after an early charge, while *Innamincka* rounded out their series with another solid second. *Okavango Delta* closed out their best day yet with a second straight fourth.

Manutara Wins Glorias Navales Cupin Higuerillas

Gabriela Portus and her crew aboard *Manutara* claimed victory at the historic **Glorias Navales Cup**, hosted by the Chilean Navy in **Higuerillas**. The regatta, sailed over two days in **light winds** and **rolling Pacific swells**, showcased the strength of the local fleet.

Second place went to *Charlie* (Federico Bierwith), followed by *Chungungo* (Horacio Salamanca), rounding out the podium in a tightly contested event.

The Chilean calendar continues in **mid-October** with the **National Championship** in **Talcahuano**, followed by the iconic **OFF Valparaíso Regatta**, to be held in **Recreo Bay (Viña del Mar)** at **Yacht Club de Chile**.



OFF will take place just two weeks before the **South American Championship**, marking the **long-awaited return of the continental title after seven years**. Excitement is building across the fleet, with teams ramping up preparations.



ARGENTINA

Gran Carajo Wins Aperturain San Roque

Following the opening events in **Patagonia's southern lakes**, the Argentine fleet moved to the center of the country for the **Apertura Championship** on **San Roque Lake, Córdoba** — raced under **Pan-American format** conditions.

A total of **29 boats** competed over **three weekends and 26 races**. The overall winner was **Javier Moyano** aboard *Gran Carajo*, followed by **Ruben Lozano** on *Quattro* and **Julian Dadone** on *Carrera*.

Nova Scotia skipper Evan Petley-Jones and the crew of *Lifted* (CAN 4025) took first place to win the first J/24 Canadian National Championship since 2019. Held during the annual Nepean One Design Regatta hosted by the Nepean Sailing Club in Ottawa, the event saw 13 entries battle it out in seven races over two days of racing.

Mike Stasko of the Canandaigua Yacht Club and the crew of *Redline* (USA 799) took second place, while local skipper Jean Levac aboard *Barking Squirrel* (CAN 5226) placed third. Petley-Jones also took Top Canadian Boat after Day One of Racing and Top Canadian Boat Overall. Wind and weather conditions varied considerably over the two days, from heavy winds and gusty conditions on day one, to light-to-moderate and steady winds on day two in sometimes blistering heat.





Petley-Jones, the previous Canadian Champion, expressed excitement about the revival of the J/24 Class Association in Canada and the possibility of more J/24 Canadian-based events in the future. Jean Levac was also enthusiastic about the regatta, noting it was one of the best NODs in years. Attendance at the event was bolstered by the participation of five US boats from the Rochester (2) and Canandaigua (2) Yacht Clubs of New York, and the Mallet's Bay Boat Club (1) of Vermont. The Royal Canadian Yacht Club and the Bay of Quinte Yacht Club were also represented. Both NSC and

Rochester J/24 Fleet representatives hope to capitalize on the success of the regatta and see more boats travelling to and from events on both sides of the border in the future.

After five years of inactivity, the J/24 Canada Class Association was revived late last year with the goal to bring J/24 enthusiasts together and holding more annual events. President Vince Somoza was more than pleased with the turnout for the Championship and expressed optimism about the future of the Class in Canada.

At the beginning of the year, the Hungarian J/24 fleet approached the new season with great aspirations. With four One Design Balaton Tour regattas, the National Championship and the Fleet Championship in the calendar, it was certain that 2025 would be a season to remember.

In May, we hosted our first open day in years, where more than 20 enthusiastic sailors discovered the thrill and beauty of J/24 sailing. Not long after, the competition season kicked off in Kenese, with 10 boats lining up on the starting line. In a closely fought contest, *Twenty Big 5* emerged victorious, narrowly ahead of *J/spot* and *Django*.

The next stop of the One Design Balaton Tour was hosted by Kereked Sailing Club. During this regatta, *J'Korszak-Laurel* dominated, finishing with just 4 points overall. Second and third places were shared between *iJroncat* and *Twenty Big 5*, both collecting 6 points.

While the first two regattas were sailed in mild conditions, the third event challenged the fleet with winds exceeding 25 knots. The international experience and confidence of *J/spot* shone through in these tough conditions, as last year's National Champion won all four races. The remaining podium spots went to *iJroncat* (12 points) and *KiJé* (14 points).



The strong winds continued for the Blue Ribbon Regatta, where five J/24s competed in the longest round-the-lake competition in Europe. After just over 13 hours of sailing, the finish line was first crossed by *Jackaroo*, likely setting an all-time record.

As we enter the second half of the season, anticipation is high for the National Championship, where we once again expect a fleet of more than 24 boats.



The Italian flag goes to La Superba. Silver for Bruschetta Guastafeste and bronze for Five for Fighting. The Championship, which saw twenty-four crews participate, concluded after eight races in the waters of Lerici. The hospitality and organization of the Circolo della VelaErix were greatly appreciated.

Lerici. The awards ceremony marked the end of the 2025 edition of the Italian J/24 Championship, a well-organized event delegated by the Italian Sailing Federation (FIV), by the Circolo della Vela Erix, with the patronage of the Municipality of Lerici and the collaboration of the Italian J/24 Class Association.

Also on the podium (second and third in order) were ITA 469 Bruschetta Guastafeste, crewed by Sonia and Alessia Ciceri, and Ancilla Scaccia, skippered by Pierluigi Puthod (LNI Mandello del Lario; 24 points; 6, 3, 1, 4, 6, 2, 12, 2).





And the winner of the sixth race, ITA 304 Five for Fighting, crewed and skippered by Eugenia De Giacomo Pitanti (CCRdLauria; 33 points; 4, 4, 9, 8, 11, 1, 4, 3, crewed by Nicola Pitanti, Matilde Pitanti, Marco Bruna, and Lorenzo Cusimano). Eugenia De Giacomo was also awarded the women's overall title.

Also receiving awards were the fourth- and fifth-place finishers, respectively, ITA 498 Pilgrim, owned by Lario Fleet Chief Mauro Benfatto and skippered by Fabio Mazzoni (LNI Mandello d.L.; 33 points; 3, 5, 5, 7, 3, 10, 5, 5)

and ITA 271 Joanna, owned by Fabrizio della Casa and skippered by Andrea Collina (CNCervia AdV; 40 points; 11, 2, 4, 5, 5, bfd, 6, 7) and the Under 25 crew ITA 092 Son of Rabbit of the Circolo Velico La Spezia, skippered by Matteo Pucci. Italy Report



The J/24 Bruschetta Guastafeste wins the 2025 Fabio Apollonio Trophy.

Well-organized by the Trentino Sailing Association on the splendid waters of Lake Caldonazzo, the fourth leg of the National J/24 Circuit concluded after four races and a great deal of hospitality. Dejavù and Armageddon also finished on the podium.

Lake Caldonazzo - Valcanover. After four races held in the splendid waters of Lake Caldonazzo in Pergine Valsugana (Valcanover) by about fifteen crews representing numerous Italian fleets, the National J/24 Regatta - Fabio Apollonio Trophy (coefficient 2) concluded successfully. The event was well organized over the weekend by the Trentino Sailing Association and serves as the fourth stage of the 2025 National Circuit.

The event, also held in memory of their friend Fabio Apollonio, former president of the Italian Class, took the top step of the podium, thanks to a hat-trick of victories, with the crew of the ITA 469 Bruschetta Guastafeste, skippered by Pierluigi Puthod and crewed by sisters Sonia and Alessia Ciceri and Ancilla Scaccia (CV Tivano; 3 points; 1,1,4,1). Second place went to Ita 476 Déjà Vu, owned and helmed by clubmate Ruggero Spreafico (CV Tivano; 7 points, 2, 2, 3, 3), ahead of Ita 461 Armagedon, owned and helmed by Fabio De Rossi (Circolo Nautico Brenzone; 9 points; 5, 11, 2, 2).

Next in line were Ita 432 Kaster, owned by Garda-Caldonazzo Fleet Chief Giuliano Catarozzi and helmed by his daughter Federica, Ubaldo Ranzi's Ita 507 Cucuia (CV Sarnico), and Francesco Nucara's Ita 438 Rabbit (CVMare).

The racing was highly technical, and the crews were forced to tack frequently to make the most of the wind variations. Despite the unstable wind, the Jury managed to hold four of the six scheduled races: three on Saturday afternoon—the first with winds that changed strength and direction several times, and the other two steady—and a beautiful race on Sunday with a long-awaited southerly wind arriving just before the start deadline.

The hospitality of Velica Trentina was impeccable, as always. Indeed, the success of this event was once again met with great satisfaction, both from the participants—who appreciated and enjoyed the excellent hospitality and delicious local products—and from the Velica Trentina board and the brothers Dario and Giuliano Cattarozzi, thanks to whom the J/24 has spread to Lake Caldonazzo.

The crews of the world's most widespread and popular one-design keelboat, designed by Rod Johnstone in 1976 but still as relevant today, will continue the 2025 National Circuit over the weekend of September 13th and 14th when the Agropoli Section of the Italian Naval League (www.leganavaleagropoli.it agropoli@leganavale.it) and Fleet Chief Peppe Manganelli will welcome the racers for the National Regatta with a coefficient of 2, valid as the fifth stage.
